Today we commemorate two pillars of the Catholic church, the Apostles Peter and Paul. Both were martyred in Rome in the first century. We read in the Gospel, at an opportune time Jesus tested His disciples with a crucial question: Who do men say that I am and who do you say that I am? (Matthew 16:13). Although Jesus was widely recognized in Israel as a mighty man of God, even being compared with the greatest of the prophets, John the Baptist, Elijah, and Jeremiah but he wanted to know how His disciples thought about Him. Peter, always quick to respond, exclaimed that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the living God. It was not a mere answer to Jesus' question but a true profession of faith. Then Jesus told Him, you are Peter and upon this rock I will build my Church. Jesus gave Him the authority (keys) and told Him that the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. He also manifested to Saul on the way to Damascus and chose Him to be the apostle of the nations. He went to the gentiles and made them know who Jesus is. Both the apostles have written the books (letters) in the Bible. They tirelessly worked for the spread of the gospel, not only to the people of Israel, but to all the nations as well. They risked their lives in the process and gladly poured out their blood in loyalty to their Master, the Lord Jesus Christ. As Paul so eloquently stated in his second epistle to Timothy, they courageously fought the good fight, finished the race, and kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7).

The Lord Jesus tests each one of us personally with the same question: Who do you say that I am? Jesus calls us too to be His witnesses to the nations like Paul and Faith in Jesus Christ makes us into rocks - spiritual stones. During this week we also celebrate July 4th, and we thank God for this beautiful country and pray for it that may God bless the United States of America and ask Him for continued guidance and wisdom for leaders, and pray for unity and justice within the nation.
